Training Program Information Packet

CORE is pleased to continue to offer its' Advanced training and Diagnostic training program for doctoral level clinical psychology students for the 2024/2025 training year! This packet provides information to applicants as well as training departments within Chicagoland schools about our practice as well as about the opportunities that trainees will have as part of our team.

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Introduction to CORE

CORE - Center of Relational Empowerment, PC is a group private practice located in downtown Chicago and downtown Evanston. We offer individual, family, and group therapy to our clients and serve children (age 5+), adolescents and adults. In addition to psychotherapy, CORE provides psychological testing, workshops, supervision, consultation, and psychoeducational seminars for people from all walks of life.

CORE's practices are strongly rooted in family systems models, however, some psychodynamic approaches, especially related to attachment/object relations theory are also used in case conceptualization and interventions. In regard to systemic models, CORE integrates a combination of Multigenerational, Structural, Contextual, and Narrative models along with Internal Family Systems (IFS). We place a strong emphasis on multicultural and diversity factors and use culturally appropriate interventions with our wide variety of clients.

The foundation of our approach is based in the idea that all of us are multifaceted, as we have different aspects of our personality. People have an innate capacity, wisdom, and intuitive knowledge that may be blocked by fears. We also acknowledge the specific circumstances and elements in a person or family's life that allows us to explore contextual issues for our clients. By working to release these fears, we are tapping into the clients' internal resources. Therefore, a client can feel empowered and bring about deep inner changes rather than superficial symptom-focused change.

Our goal is to help our clients to feel empowered to handle previously overwhelming problems or difficulties by providing them the space to grow in a nurturing environment. At CORE we help our clients strengthen their core selves, and in doing so, empower them to strengthen their relationships with others. At the heart of CORE is our belief that all people have leadership and healing qualities - perspective, confidence, compassion, and acceptance - crucial to our highest, most harmonious functioning.

CORE believes that psychotherapy can help uncover long-standing patterns and behaviors that can get in the way of feeling fulfilled in our relationships with ourselves and with others. We believe that no family or cultural system operates the same way and that there is no "right" way to live life. Therefore, it is our goal to understand the problems our clients face through their own context in order to find the meanings and solutions that work best for them. CORE utilizes Psychological Testing as a way to help clients better understand their symptoms, clarify diagnosis, and get support for their specific needs.

Dr. Rios is a Licensed Clinical Psychologist and Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist. She has been a supervisor for doctoral students for many years and she is also an AAMFT Approved Supervisor. Dr. Rios enjoys working with a broad spectrum of clients and is excited by learning and understanding the unique elements that all of her clients bring with them in therapy. Dr. Peoples is passionate about providing clinical supervision as she works to ensure that students are adequately trained to be independent clinicians. The Systems approach is integral to his clinical work as well as his supervision approach. He has a background in providing mentorship in addition to supervision and enjoys connecting with students. He is in a unique position as a supervisor for this training program, as he was a former extern at CORE and has firsthand experience with the training program. Dr. Rice is collaborative in his supervision approach and highlights student strengths as a means of helping them use what is natural for them with their clients. In addition to therapy supervision, Dr. Rice also enjoys helping students understand various components of psychological testing and strengthen their skills in administration, interpretation, and report writing skills.

Training Program Overview

All Interventions and Supervision will take place on-site at CORE – Center of Relational Empowerment, PC. The exceptions to this are when Illinois has issued stay-at-home orders in which students will be supervised and see clients virtually. Students can expect to conduct teletherapy in the next training year, and potentially integrate in-person therapy when it is safe to do so.

Type of Training Opportunity: **Advanced Practicum**

• Students must have completed at least two years of training prior to beginning CORE's training program. One year of previous diagnostic training and one year of previous therapy training is required.

Number of <u>Advanced Practicum</u> Positions offered for 2024/2025: **3**

Type of Training Opportunity: **Diagnostic Practicum**

• Students must have completed all psychological testing courses prior to beginning CORE's training program. (Addressing Cognitive, Objectives, Projective/Personality, etc.)

Number of Diagnostic Positions offered for 2024/2025: 2

For All Trainees: Number of Days Required per week: 2.5

- 2 full days + half day for didactics/group supervision
- All trainees must be available on Friday mornings

Hours of Individual Supervision per Week*: 1

Hours of Group Supervision per Week*: 1

*While, formal supervision is listed at 2 hours per week, a supervisor, licensed psychologist, or other licensed staff will be either onsite or available remotely at all times for trainees to access when questions or challenges arise.

Applying to CORE's Training Program

<u>Practicum Match Day</u>, when all decisions will be finalized:

Monday, March 18, 2024

Required Application Materials:

- Cover Letter stating your intent and interest in applying to our training program
- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Three Letters of Recommendation:
 - Advanced students: at least two should be from previous practicum supervisors)
 - <u>Diagnostic students</u>: at least one should be from a professor from an assessment course.
- A Sample Integrative Psychological Testing Report (de-identified for confidentiality)
- A Sample Case Conceptualization write-up using at least one Family Systems theory. (ADVANCED APPLICANTS ONLY)

Note: We will do our best to match students accepted to the training program with their desired location, however, students should be prepared to work in either the Downtown Chicago or Evanston location. Both locations are accessible by CTA & Metra (within 1-2 blocks).
